What is Title I?

Myers Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Myers Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Myers Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Myers Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Myers Elementary School invited all parents to attend our annual input parent meeting last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual parent input meeting.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Myers Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, after revision, we will send the plan to all parents in August via Remind before the scheduled open house event. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2022-2023 District Goals

Goal 1: By the end of FY23, the percent of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on GA Milestones Assessment will increase by 2% in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance.

Goal 2: Increase the percentage of referred students who access school-based mental health services by 2% each year (with FY21 being the baseline year) to decrease the number of OSS days in grade 6-12

2022-2023 School Goals

By the end of the FY23 school year, MES will increase by 50% of students meeting or exceeding Fall to Spring projected growth target as measured by NWEA MAP. Baseline Fall 2022 to Spring 2023 MAP growth report.

By the end of the FY23 school year, MES: will have 90% of students master 90% of their addition and subtraction math facts, 90% of multiplication facts and 75% of division required math facts in Grades K-5, as measured by Hall County Schools Math Fluency Benchmarks.

During the 2022-2023 school year, 100% of Myers staff will support social emotional learning development and resiliency for each student as measured by implementing Sources of Strength classroom lesson and PBIS classroom management lessons.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Myers Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the

Parent Annual event and the Parent Input meeting. The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.

Meet with your child's teacher, they will share out effective routines, practices and expectations to help your child be successful in literacy and numeracy this school year.

Curriculum Night for grades 3-5 – August 25, 2022 5:30 pm

Meet with your child's teacher, they will share out effective routines, practices and expectations to help your child be success this school year.

Monthly Parent Academy meetings- 9:00am-10:00am

We invite parents to attend sessions with specific topics, such as, Literacy, Eureka Math, Technology uses, GA Milestones testing, Access testing, 5th to 6th transitions, Parent Portal, and other timely topics.

Is your child on track? Parent Meeting/ Student Achievement – January 24, 2023 9:00am and 5:30pm

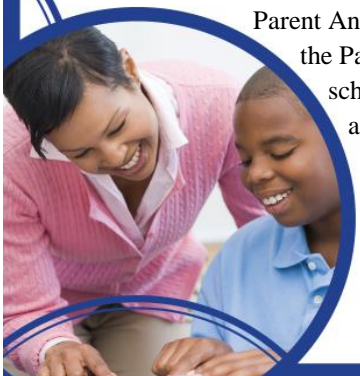
Lear about how to know if your child is making adequate progress and how you can assist your child in enhancing his/her knowledge.

Myers Elementary is Branching Out!

Myers Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.
- ✓ Participate in Canvas professional development modules at least four times a year to train staff on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement.
- ✓ Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning including 5th to 6th grade.
- ✓ Share information in English and Spanish on the school parent newsletter and in the school newsletter for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- ✓ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding schoolwide events and activities, through phone messages, Remind, social media, and flyers.
- ✓ An annual orientation meeting where parents will meet their child's teacher and be reassured of their right and responsibility to be involved in their child's education. (August Open House and Title I meeting)
- ✓ One Head-start Pre-K is housed at Myers and students are involved with most regular school activities. Spring orientation is provided for community Pre-K programs for students to visit the schools.
 - ✓ Use our Partners in Education and School-Community Team to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parent and family engagement policy.
 - ✓ Offer literacy and computer classes for parents and family members to help further enhance their various educational levels.
- ✓ An online survey (yearly) for all parents will be conducted to collect opinions and concerns of parents about the current program and to collect suggestions for improvement and topics for meetings that meet the needs of parents.
- ✓ Partner with Head Start through the District Parent Outreach Facilitator. The District Parent Outreach Facilitator meets with parents and families providing information and resources to support school orientation for parents, families and students to assist in successful student transitions to kindergarten.
