Our Goals for Student Achievement

2025-2026 District Goals

FY26 Goal 1: By the end of FY26, the percentage of all students moving into the "Proficient and Distinguished" (combined) levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2%.

FY26 Goal 2: By the end of FY26, increase the percentage of referred students who access school based mental health services in order to increase the overall school climate rating for HCS D by 1% (from 86.74 to 87.74).

FY26 Goal 1:

Literacy: GROWTH: 55% OF STUDENTS WILL MEET OR EXCEED FALL TO SPRING PROJECTED GROWTH TARGET AS MEASURED BY NWEA-MAP ELA. ACHIEVEMENT: MES WILL INCREASE THE SCHOOLWIDE MEDIAN ACHIEVEMENT PERCENTILE BY 3%, FROM THE 36TH PERCENTILE (BASELINE SPRING 2025) TO THE 39TH PERCENTILE BY SPRING 2026 ON THE ELA MAP GROWTH ASSESSMENT.

Numeracy: GROWTH: 65% OF STUDENTS WILL MEET OR EXCEED FALL TO SPRING PROJECTED GROWTH TARGET AS MEASURED BY NWEA-MAP MATH. ACHIEVEMENT: MES WILL INCREASE THE SCHOOLWIDE MEDIAN ACHIEVEMENT PERCENTILE BY 3%, FROM THE 51ST PERCENTILE (BASELINE SPRING 2025) TO 54TH PERCENTILE BY SPRING 2026 ON THE MATH MAP GROWTH ASSESSMENT.

FY26 Goal 2:

DURING THE FY26 SCHOOL YEAR, WE WILL INCREASE FAMILY ENGAGEMENT AND PARTICIPATION IN ORDER TO SUPPORT SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT LITERACY AND NUMERACY GOALS.

Activities to Build Partnerships:

Myers Elementary provides parents with opportunities to build partnerships with the school by:

- *Inviting Parents to participate in Parent Academy monthly meetings
- *Supporting parents with resources on teacher Canvas pages, school website, games, and books
- *Offering Parent Workshops
- *Organizing Parent-Teacher conferences
- * Send home weekly student folders with updates from homeroom teacher

Communication about Student Learning:

Myers Elementary is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Communication between the school/teachers with families includes:

- *Offer a minimum of two parent conferences with each parent to explain grade level expectations, students' current level of progress, assessments, and strategies to increase student achievement in numeracy and literacy
- *Maintain daily contact with families through the use of Remind, student agendas, newsletters and/or work folders.
- *Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress

Teachers, Parents, and Students--Better Together

Teacher/School Responsibilities:

- Provides Parent Workshop opportunities for parents to assist in understanding and supporting the curriculum and standards their child is learning at each respective grade level
- Offer a minimum of 2 parent conferences with each parent to fully explain grade level expectations and students' current level of progress, assessments, and strategies to increase student achievement in math and literacy
- Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.
- Provide parents opportunities to build partnerships with the school.

Family Responsibilities:

- Attend Parent Workshops or get the information from my child's teacher, if I cannot attend in person or via Zoom
- Ensure my child reads at home to improve vocabulary, fluency and comprehension
- Practice math facts with my child to increase fact fluency
- Awareness of student's MAP Growth goals in literacy and numeracy

Student Responsibilities

- Use a variety of math resources to support our math goal of building math fluency
- Become a better speaker and listener in order to fully participate in school and master grade level appropriate listening and speaking standards
- Utilize the strategies we have learned in Reader's and Writer's Workshop
